Forgeries of the 1914 issue

1st set Appeared March 1958. Sheets lacks the rough marginal framing.

Type VII (T15) and VIII (T42) genuine Lhasa postmarks. Also 7-lines telegraphic

genuine mk.

4 tr. a. dark blue 21F8 thick fiberous paper

b. dull blue 21D5 c. grey blue 21C4

Six clichés to the sheet. The blue stamps are in fact printed with a 8 tr. cliché.

8 tr. a. red 10B7 thick fiberous paper

b. scarlet 9A7

Six clichés to the sheet.

2nd set Appeared March 1973. Reproduced from Haverbeck's handbook.

Only known "unused".

4 tr. dark ultramarine 20A8

3rd set Appeared March 1973. Set up from a single cliché. Marginal framing

were printed in a separate operation. Guidelines visible in margins.

Only known "unused".

8 tr. pale rose 12A3

A tete-beche exist.

4th set Appeared late 1982. Six different clichés in a sheet. Sheets are only known unused.

	c. carmine red	11C8
	d. dark carmine red	11D8
	e. grey violet	16D3

Forged covers with a forged LHASSA pmk close to type V (Hellr. F129) are known.
